Explain me this: Coverage encourages generalization and Statistical Preemption constrains it

How is that native English speakers find novel patterns such as She tweeted them the story stubbornly judge She explained unremarkable but him the to story be unacceptable? Experimental evidence demonstrates that productivity is encouraged by Coverage (roughly the extent to which the required generalization has been previously attested). It is constrained by statistical preemption: the existence of a more conventional, accessible alternative. I will also raise the possibility that preemption may be less effective in second language speakers.
